Dear Corpus Christi Families,

It is hard to believe that we are in the last week of Term 3!

Students in Years 2-6 are working hard to complete their Educational Research Projects (ERP) on their chosen interest related to our school focus this term on 'Cultural Diversity'. This is the first ERP that the Year 2/3 students have worked on and a huge focus has been developing their ability to locate and research appropriate information and transferring it into their own words. All students have learnt how to safely use the internet to research information.

Students have also focused on extending their skills in writing narratives to engage their reader, with sizzling starts, descriptive vocabulary and further developing cohesion in their writing with the use time connectives and conjunctions (joining words). From the writing I have viewed when visiting classrooms it has been impressive the development I have seen. The Foundation/1 students have been developing their writing skills in writer workshop lessons and their motivation and focus to work on their written pieces has been inspiring. Please make sure you view Storypark where the presentations of ERP's and narratives are likely to be shared. Please also encourage your child/ren to talk about what has interested them while learning about Cultural Diversity this term.

Our focus for next term is 'Change Over Time' and teachers have already busy planning and organising excursions to deepen their understanding around this unit of work. Over the holidays is a perfect opportunity to have discussions with your child/ren about what things have changed over time when you were growing up in the areas of school, hobbies/games, technology, the local community and fads of the time. Involving grandparents or older relatives is a great way to broaden their awareness and interest.

Our School intensive Swimming Program will begin for four days in Term 4 Week 8 at Elite Swimming Pool in Pascoe Vale due to refurbishment of the Fawkner Pool. The Swimming in Schools initiative supports the delivery of quality swimming and water safety education so Victorian Government primary and Catholic primary school students have the opportunity to:

- learn how to swim
- develop lifelong skills in water safety to reduce their risk of drowning and injury.

Throughout the course of your child's primary schooling it is encouraged that students are able to demonstrate the knowledge and skills in:

- Water Safety Knowledge understanding safety and rules for a range of aquatic environments
- Swimming continuously over a distance
- Surface dive, swim underwater and search to recover an object from deep water
- Lifesaving Understanding how to respond to an emergency by demonstrating DRSAB (Danger, Response, Send for help, Airways & Breathing)
- Rescue Skills

The swimming program is a compulsory program that all children at Corpus Christi are expected to participate in and is included in our school levies. Further details will be sent home closer to the date.

We wish all families a relaxing and safe break and look forward to seeing you all in Term 4.


